These are examples of the 171 successful veterinary treatments during the past year via the FHSTJ veterinary care certificates. Read more below about how the FHSTJ Certificate Program provides rescued animals with immediate care.

VETERINARY CERTIFICATE PROGRAM AND OTHER SERVICES

The certificate program was initiated two years ago in order that rescuers could have immediate resources in hand and be able to immediately take an animal in need to a qualified veterinarian. They do not have to wait until they solicit sufficient funds to cover veterinary expenses. Lead rescuers have certificates that can be shared with people with limited resources as well as other rescuers throughout the city. Sick and injured animals no longer have to wait in pain and fear, sometimes for days or weeks, until they receive treatment. In addition to medical treatments via the FHSTJ Certificate Program, FHSTJ provided resources for 1000+ free spay/neuter surgeries for pets of people with very limited resources; 1500+ treatments for mange and parasites at street events; 85+ adoptions in San Diego and Tijuana; and supported rescuers with an average daily census of 40 animals. The official IRS 990 fiscal year narrative will appear in the December newsletter and after FHSTJ files its report to the IRS which is due in November of 2019. How the FHSTJ Certificate Program saved a mother cat and kitten.






A pregnant cat [left] was rescued by a person with limited resources. The cat had severe difficulties giving birth. She had given birth to 4 dead kittens and one was stuck in the birth canal[right]. She was in severe pain and dying as was the kitten. An FHSTJ volunteer was contacted and immediately took her to a veterinarian. The mother cat and kitten were saved. [photos above]. A TRIBUTE TO CHARLIE

There are times when we rescue animals that are so damaged physically or psychologically that they are not suitable to be adopted by persons who do not know how to cope with them. We are fortunate to have some rescuers who will take these animals, sometimes for the life of the animal, so that they can live out their life in a secure and loving environment. That was the case with Charlie. He was rescued by FHSTJ in 2008 from a "hoarder"who had him in a small cage for at least two years. He was malnourished, had a lot of muscle atrophy and extremely frightened. The vet estimated his age at that time to be about 4 years old. Since the time of his rescue, he remained with the same loving rescuer. FHSTJ has been providing Charlie and 25 other dogs like him with food, medicine, supplies and veterinary care. Charlie just passed away. He lived to the ripe old age of 15. Here is the last photo we have of Charlie with his care giver. He remained fairly healthy up until the last few days of his life. In spite of his advanced age he still wanted to stand and walk a bit. Charlie will be missed.

- 3. Do they provide donors with periodic reports?


